

ON GOING WORK IN EDUCATION, HEALTH & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT



Aquaculture

In aquaculture existing water bodies are developed to create additional water areas for large scale fish production. It can also include rehabilitation of marshy and swampy lands, developing them into modern fish production systems.

In the coastal Kendrapada district of Odisha, 5 ponds are being renovated for aquaculture farming and production with support from DCB Bank in collaboration with Concern. 75 beneficiaries from 5 villages will be trained on aquaculture farming and entrepreneurship development. 25,000 fingerlings/advanced yearlings will be provided to them, equipping them for sustainable aquaculture farming, thereby greatly enhancing their incomes and bringing overall benefit to the villages.

Suraksha

Concern India Foundation continues its efforts to promote good health and personal hygiene among school children under the Suraksha programme. 500 hygiene kits were distributed to students from various schools in Pune.

Students were educated on issues such as child abuse, personal safety and hygiene.

The aim of Concern's Suraksha programme is to empower children and equip them with the knowledge and skills needed to stay safe and healthy.





Scholarship for students from underprivileged or marginalised backgrounds

A meeting was organised in Mumbai with some of the beneficiaries under the Scholarship for Students from Underprivileged and Marginalised Backgrounds to understand their requirements for the year 2023-24. In the meeting, the children shared their experiences of the previous year. Fees support is given for college, hostel, coaching class/entrance exams/competitive exams, etc. thus enabling them to continue their education. Sessions will be organised with a career counsellor to provide insights on their aptitude and suitable professions or further education. About 600 students in need will be supported with scholarships under different categories in 2023-24.

ON GROUND EXPERIENCE SHARING



Water is an invaluable resource that requires preservation. Concern recognises its significance and has implemented watershed projects in several states including Odisha, Rajasthan, Maharashtra, Karnataka, and Andhra Pradesh, with active community participation.

These projects encompass a range of measures such as soil water treatment, renovation or construction of percolation tanks, Gabion walls, check dams, canal de-silting and deepening. This improves water retention and management. During the heavy rains caused by a cyclone on June 11th, all the water structures in Marathwada were filled to capacity. For the first time, flowing water was successfully halted and collected, which proved to be a significant boon for the neighboring areas. This achievement showcases the positive impact of our efforts and the benefits they bring to the local communities.


