The pandemic posed challenges for Raju, with dwindling orders and a sluggish market. Post-pandemic, economic struggles persisted for weavers. Recognizing the need for adaptation, Raju joined the training on Market Exposure Programme by Concern India Foundation under the Weavers Project, acquiring skills in content creation and digital marketing.

Venturing online, especially on Facebook, yielded astounding results. Raju now has 3,998 followers and an expanding international



clientele, receiving orders from America and Canada. His success showcases the power of support, digital training, and turning adversity into prosperity. It reflects our commitment to quality craftsmanship and fostering self-reliance in our community.
